Full System Overview:

Wall System (EXPLAIN ONLY – NO PRACTICAL)

Typical Build-Up:

1. Primer / breathable base
 2. Hydro Paint
 3. Spray Granite
 4. PU Topcoat (breathable finish)

Key Teaching Points:

- Walls must remain **breathable**
 - Use PU Topcoat — NOT heavy resin systems
 - Suitable for:
 - Internal walls
 - External renders
 - Feature walls
-

Common Mistakes:

- Using non-breathable coatings
 - Poor substrate prep
 - Not sealing alkali surfaces
-

 Position clearly:

Full wall systems are covered in the Advanced Wall Course

Countertop System (Overview)

- Poly Rapid → Spray Granite → DiamondCoat → ArmourGuard
-

Floor System (Overview)

- Pour System Primer → Poly Rapid → Spray Granite → Diamond Coat → ArmourGuard
-

CRITICAL TRAINING POINT – MIXING & POT LIFE

- All 2K systems = limited working time
 - Mix small batches only
